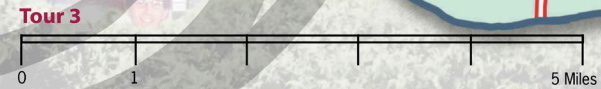
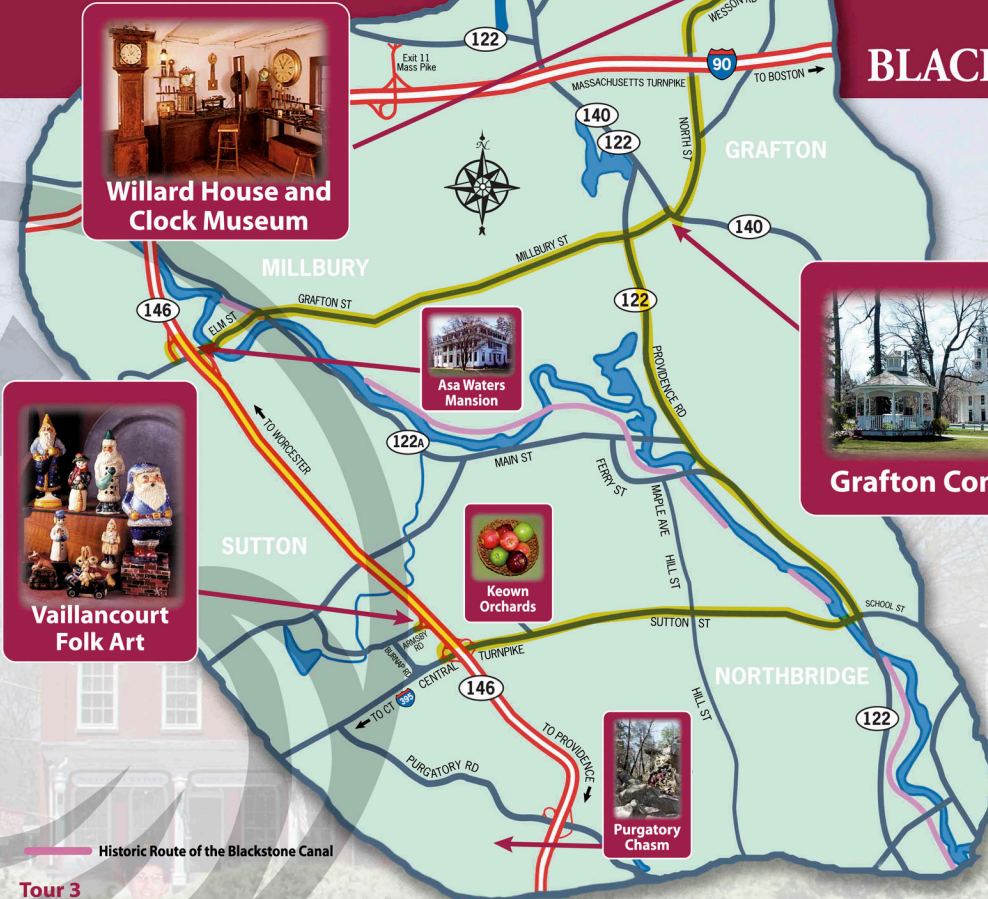

Directions from Vaillancourt Folk Art to Grafton Common: From Armsby Rd. go south on Route 146. Exit at Central Turnpike and head east. You will pass Keown's Orchard on your left. (Central Turnpike changes to Sutton St.). Continue on and turn left onto Route 122 (Providence Rd.) and head north. (Providence Rd. changes to Worcester St. in Grafton.) Turn right on Millbury St.

Directions from Grafton Common to Willard House and Clock Museum: Take North St. to Wesson Rd. and turn right. Continue to Willard St. and turn left.

Directions from Willard House and Clock Museum to Vaillancourt Folk Art: Turn right onto Willard Street, right onto Wesson Rd., then left onto North St. to Grafton Common. Make a right then a quick right onto Millbury St. Follow the signs to Route 146. Take 146 South to Armsby Rd. exit.
